## November's parish e-bulletin – news and information from South Cambridgeshire District Council

Welcome to November's edition of our regular parish e-bulletin. As before, this edition includes information that parish councils may want to discuss, important notices we want you to be aware of, as well as news from around the district.

### 1) Reminder of winter bin collection changes

From Monday 1 December we will be moving to monthly green bin collections during the winter moths of December, January and February. Black and blue bin collections will remain unchanged. Fortnightly green bin collections will resume in March.

Christmas collection changes will affect all residents, with some dates moving forward as well as back. Collections will be made up until 27 December, break until 4 January and return to normal on 5 January. Posters highlighting this change will be sent to Parish Councils to display.

#### 2) Parish Precepts - final call

Last month we sent an important letter to all parish councils about your estimated tax base for 2015-16. We are reminding you that the letter asks you to check our estimates and raise queries before the tax base is formally set next month. The letter included a table setting out how the estimated parish tax base for 2015-16 is made up and an explanation of how the tax base is calculated.

This is a final reminder for you to contact us by the end of November.

A second consultation letter will be sent to you in December to confirm the tax base for each parish, and to consult on the parish precepts. Please look out for this and take action when it arrives.
