Dear John,

I'm writing from Wysing Arts Centre and Kettle's Yard. I manage our young peoples' programme, Circuit.

Circuit is a national network connecting 15-25 year olds to the visusal arts and is led by the Tate.

We have a *Circuit* group of 15-25 year olds who meet regularly at Wysing & Kettle's Yard to devise, plan, and deliver activity that will engage other young people in the arts. The group have been working with artist Rebecca Birch to develop ideas for a project that they would like to deliver in Cambourne. A couple of the members of the group live in Cambourne and are very keen on delivering an activity there.

The group have spent a few weeks exploring Cambourne and have decided that they'd like to make a film about the town and screen it to the public. They've identified the outside wall of the Hub and the empty plot next to it (W7) as a space they would like to use for the screening. The event will be free and open to all - but will have an emphasis on attracting other young people.

I've attached an outline of the project.

Please could you let me know who at the Parish Council would be the best person to cantact to discuss the project and to seek necessary permissions for the event, and to discuss all other health & satety and logistical considerations; and most importantly to discuss whether the Parish Council feel this event would be of benefit to the community and whether our project is something you would like to partner with us on (we have a budget to cover costs). We're really keen that the project is a beneficial offering and so we're flexible in terms of when and where we deliver the screening.

PROJECT OUTLINE – CIRCUIT GROUP & REBECCA BIRCH APRIL 2014

Cambournia W7 (working title) is a film made in Cambourne. The making of the film involves a series of interventions (shoots), which would require cooperation, and encourage contribution from the Cambourne community. The final event will be a screening in plot W7, aka the blank wall of the Hub (Community Centre) viewed from the empty plot to be shops.

Aims

- We would like to inspire curiosity and make a connection with the people of Cambourne and provide an opportunity for people to come together. Through this work we hope to strengthen relationships between Wysing, Kettles Yard and Cambourne.
- We would like to make the process interesting for the Circuit group and to enable individual personal development within the project.
- To challenge ourselves artistically and creatively to produce an interesting, inspiring and exciting event.



Context

Over the past 5 weeks we have been exploring Cambourne through mapping and engaging local residents in conversations. We have noticed, and been thinking about thresholds in the town- for example between new urban spaces and existing countryside or between public and private spaces.

We have also been thinking about the surreal nature of this of this New Town that hasn't yet had time to evolve and grow, and has instead been created by planners. We noticed many blank spaces, such as the ones along the High Street, which are waiting for shops to be built, and for which narratives have yet to be made. Following our research in Cambourne we decided to focus our project along the high street, as this is meant to be the focal point of the town.




Proposed Activity

Alongside our curiosity about these aspects of Cambourne, we have, through watching and talking with residents in the town tried to work out the best way of making contact with young people. We realized that many young people are waiting, and hoping for something to happen. We decided that a series of surprising interventions would attract attention, and help to build the curiosity of the residents and in particular the young people of Cambourne. We hope that the filming process will do this through 3 ways

- 1. Creating an intervention and filming it, for example, a sculptural and sound installation in the woods
- 2. Occupying a place such as the bus stop and engaging with people who pass by or come to that place, to perform an action for the film.
- 3. Engaging with existing groups, such as bands or choirs, and inviting them to perform to camera.

In order to attract attention to the filming process we will transform the Wysing van into a set vehicle- with signage that will attract attention. On each filming day (there will be 5 in total) the presence of the van will attract attention to the activity around it- which will include the filming crew, and the location catering- a gazebo set up serving drinks and snacks, such as cookies (a branch of Millie's cookies was a suggestion for improving the town from Shaney, (one of the young people we met in Cambourne) to any residents who come to see what we are up to. We will invite everyone that we encounter during the filming to the screening event and will circulate postcards that will start to spread word about the screening



The final screening will be an evening event for the general public in central Cambourne. We will be targeting the event at the 15-25 age group- but it will be open to all residents. The screening will show the film, but may also include live elements- such as participants in the film appearing within the audience, and live music. We will be contacting local food companies and projects to invite them to have food stalls at the event and will create customized seating for watching the film (ideas so far include customized picnic blankets and cushions, or pallet chairs designed by members of the group).

Hi Roger,

The map is just an overview of the route map and these do not have all of the details that you mention such as roundabouts.

The map has been blow up which is why Highfields looks so close. We've cut the rest of the route off so the Highfields is actually right next door to caldecote (see attached map).

Buses will not be layingover at Monkfield Lane so this is not a problem, there is no layover before buses depart as they run straight through. Buses change their destination at Cambourne Morrisons on the way into Cambourne so that they show Cambridge on the front when travelling around the rest of Cambourne.

Yes it has added 15 minutes to the journey but this is the only way that we can include Upper Cambourne within our route as the bus gate is no longer being built connecting Upper Cambourne and Broadway.

Customers from Great Cambourne who do not wish to stay on the bus whilst it goes around Upper Cambourne can walk to the High Street and catch the bus before it goes to Lower Cambourne and then onto Cambridge.
