

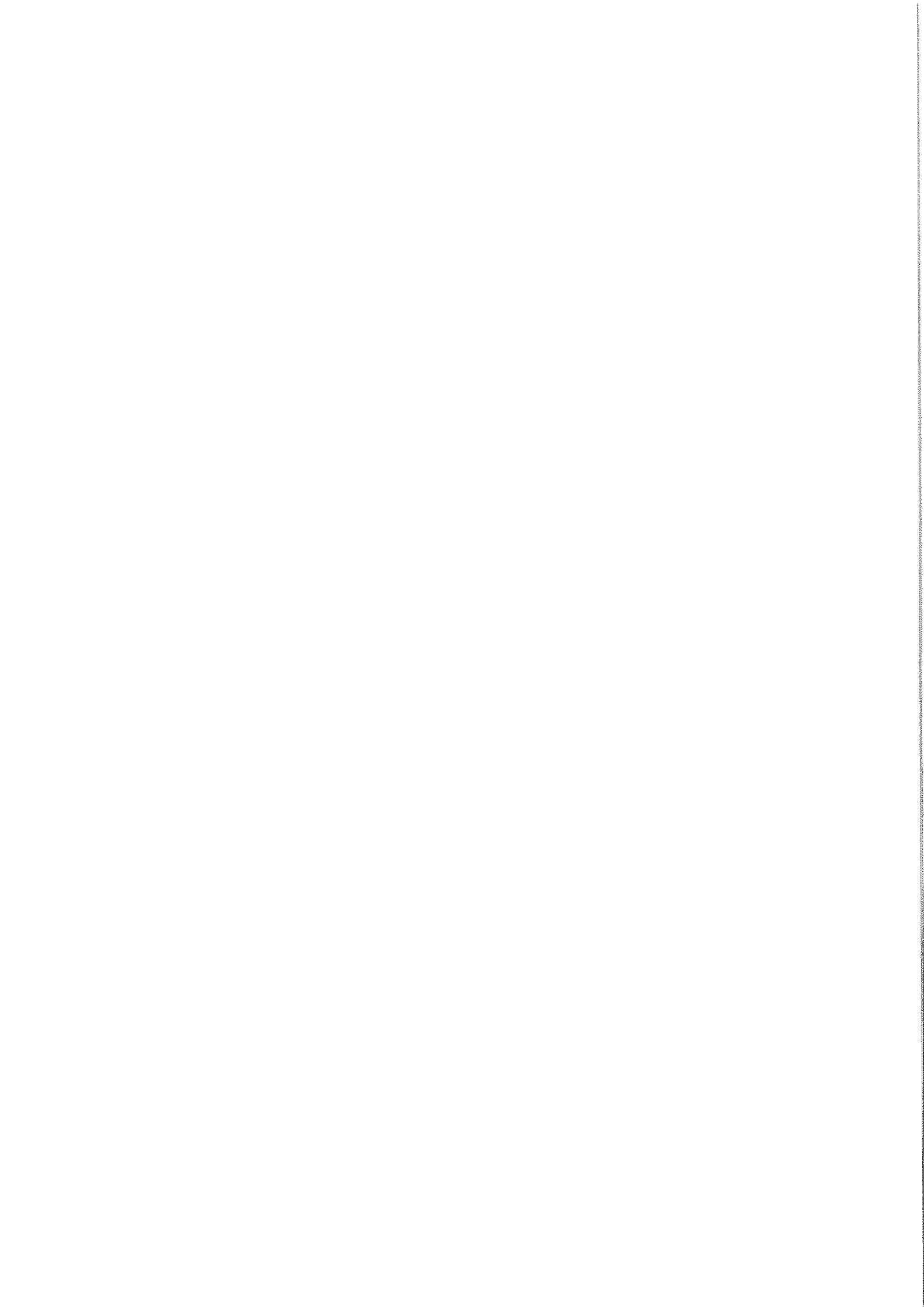

Subject: New Timebank software - Time Online 2 (TOL2)

Dear Members,

I'm writing to let you know about a change to the way you access your online Timebank account. Shortly (in a few weeks) we will transfer over to a new system called Time Online 2, or TOL2 for short.

Cambourne Timebank members have been using a system called Time and Talents, provided by an American organisation called hOurworld. This means that your data is hosted in the United States. This is not ideal under the GDPR, so we would like to transfer to a new system that is hosted in the UK. In previous years, hOurworld has provided Time and Talents free, but in 2018 they started to charge us because they needed to do some development work on the system; this is another reason for us to switch.

Cambourne Timebank is already a member of Timebanking UK, the UK's national body for Timebanking. Timebanking UK have developed their own software for Timebanks to use as an online database for securely storing data and arranging exchanges called Time Online 2 (TOL2). Access to TOL2 is included in our membership fee, no extra charge. Timebanking UK are able to make a mass transfer of all the data from Time and Talents to TOL2 so you don't need to do anything at this stage. The hours in your Timebank account will be carried over so you will have the same balance, you won't lose your hours.

I will give you more information as we get closer to the transfer date. It will mean that once we have transferred, you have to log in to a different website to access your Timebank account. I will confirm all the log in details and procedure with you before we go live. For now it's business as usual, I'm just giving you a heads up. The other Timebanks in Cambridgeshire are already using TOL2 successfully and it looks clearer and more user-friendly than the existing system, so I think you will notice a positive change.

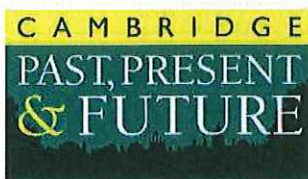

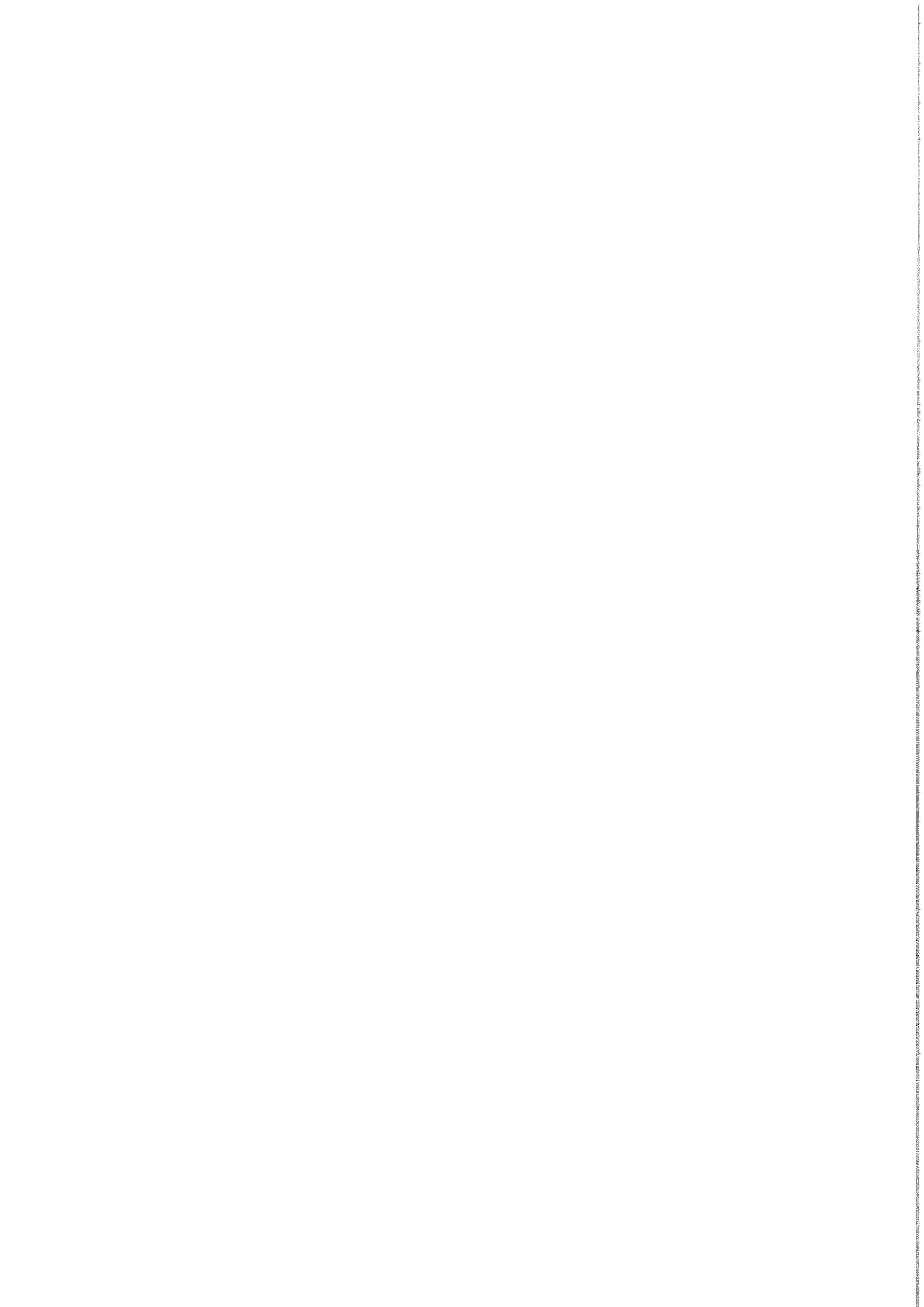

Dear All,

We are sorry to hear of your constituents issues and problems and hope that her child has recovered.

The Local Planning Authority consult with and work with the NHS to ensure that the development we approve contain the appropriate facilities and/or deliver contributions to deliver additional services to meet the demand that those developments will create. In providing healthcare facilities for Cambourne, the NHS took the view that providing new and additional facilities to provide additional services to existing facilities in Cambourne Centre (Sackville House). Once delivered it is for the NHS to ensure that the money is appropriately spent.

In the case of the additional 950 homes an initial contribution of £165,000 from the 950 S106 was drawn down in 2012 and used to create additional capacity at Sackville House through a reconfiguration of existing space without extending the building. Additional funds have also been secured with £522,000 remains unspent which is being targeted as a contribution towards extending and delivering improvements to Sackville House. We understand the NHS is now looking at how an extension would be configured to meet their requirements.

In terms of Cambourne West a further £970,250 would be secured from the Cambourne West S106 Contributions towards Healthcare. We considered whether to deliver a facility on site as part of the commercial floorspace to be delivered on Cambourne West and the LPA and the Developer would have been happy to include such a facility. However we were advised by the NHS that it would not support a new surgery at Cambourne West due to the revenue cost of running a satellite facility, which would not benefit from the economies of scale that are offered by Sackville House with shared admin staff, reception facilities etc.. Therefore, in order to make the greatest use of S106 and public money the NHS considered that an extension of Sackville House was the most appropriate way to meet the needs of Cambourne West residents. In terms of the delivery of its public function the NHS are best placed to advise on the capacity and running of their service.

We note that during as the planning application for Cambourne West was considered a number of the public responses to this application questioned how the health needs for new residents could be met when the existing facility struggles with the present demand. The problems experienced at Cambourne medical practice relate in part to the level of funding they receive from national government as well as difficulties in attracting staff to the practice. The latter is a problem that is not just experienced at Cambourne. This was reported to Members in their determination of the application.

Therefore a figure of £1,492,250 is ready to be provided for NHS improvements and enhancements to healthcare. The NHS considers is best placed to be delivered in Sackville House (or an extended facility in this location). Some enhancements have already been delivered. We continue to work with the NHS and partners to secure optimal delivery of contributions and this should deliver improvements to the service and capacity of Sackville House.

It appears that what your constituent experienced was unfortunate and we sympathise with her, but there are funds and resources to be placed at the NHS' disposal to deliver improvements to health services in Cambourne, and the NHS believe the town centre is the best place for this to occur as an expansion to existing facilities.
