District Councillor Bhattacharya Report – November 2019

Transport within Cambourne and outgoing

Having used the public transport to Cambourne, I never understood why there wasn't a bus service to Upper Cambourne in the evening, and there's no service on Sundays either. This led me to survey the populous in Cambourne, and the results showed that many others shared the same concerns as myself. The next stage was to contact the correct person from Stagecoach and make them understand how people had resorted to getting off at the Broadway and walking into upper Cambourne at night, through the completely dark path over the motorway. Furthermore, residents oftentimes must walk over one and a half miles from the town centre to reach the corners of Gladiator road, which is a hassle especially in cold winter days.

As Cambourne's size increases, having a cheaper bus dedicated inside Cambourne is almost essential, and will help residents go shopping, go to school and get to the village college or the business park as well. A morning and evening service for the Science park, Addenbrookes and St. Neots will reduce congestion, and allow daily commuters a cheaper more environmentally friendly method of travel. Cllr Mark Howell helped me to meet the operational director of Stagecoach, we had a positive discussion and finally he came to see Cambourne on October 7th, we showed him around all three villages to places such as The Village College, Business Park, West Cambourne and Upper Cambourne. I requested the Director to join the community events in Cambourne and give the residents an opportunity to express their opinions. We will be meeting every six weeks to follow-up. Although the process is not fast, it's a good starting point to get the conversation started on this important matter for the residents of Cambourne.

Free littler picking kits

Council's Waste Policy Team offered the **free littler picking kits for the communities** which have been funded as part of the Government's High Streets Community Clean Up programme. To meet the funding criteria, Waste Policy Team are offering the kits first to larger places with highstreets.

These kits include: litter pickers, bag hoops, Hi Viz vests and gloves. **20 kits** can be delivered to the parishes; it can be kept and stored and can be used when it is needed, that will avoid the need to request on an ad hoc basis.

Designated Funds

More information on how to apply for Highways England's Designated Funds scheme, including the requirements set to secure the funding, can be found on the following website: https://www.gov.uk/guidance/highways-england-designated-funds

Acceptable projects must fall into one of five categories: environment; cycling, safety and integration (CSI); air quality; innovation; and growth and housing.

The funds, once given, need to be spent within the 12-month period which can limit the scope. For instance, people could apply to have a feasibility study / design done for a footpath in one year and once complete, could then apply to build the footpath in the second year.
