15.1 Adam Speed- Anglian Water Email

Dear John Vickery

Our plans to build two new reservoirs in the East of England, one in the Fens in partnership with Cambridge Water, and another in Lincolnshire, are progressing well and we'll soon be moving to consultation.

To provide an overview of the projects and help our stakeholders prepare for public consultation in the autumn, we've produced a stakeholder briefing pack which is attached to this email.

This pack is a useful guide to the proposed reservoir projects, and gives a summary of why they are needed, the benefits they could bring and the factors we've considered to identify locations.

In August, we hosted a webinar for councillors to introduce the reservoirs. It was great to hear from so many of our stakeholders and we hope you found the session informative.

For those that weren't able to attend, the briefing pack covers many of the topics discussed in the webinar.

In response to the questions raised at the meeting, we've collated information on our proposals which we've included below. We hope this is helpful.

Q. What planning process will the reservoirs go through?

A. Both projects are classified as Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects (NSIPs). In order to build them, we would need to apply to the Planning Inspectorate for a Development Consent Order (DCO).

Q. What water sources will be used to fill the reservoirs?

A. We plan for the Lincolnshire reservoir to be fed from the River Witham, supported in turn by the River Trent. The Fens reservoir will be served primarily from the Great Ouse catchment. The abstraction will mostly be taken in the winter and stored up for use in the summer and dry periods.

Q. When will the location of the reservoirs be announced?

A. We are preparing to launch our first phase of consultation in the autumn. We will announce the proposed locations for the reservoirs at this point. The consultation will ask for feedback on our proposed locations, the concept designs for each reservoir and the benefits they could create.

Q. When will you notify potentially affected landowners?

A. We will contact potentially affected landowners and occupiers in the coming days. We will also notify appropriate elected representatives, so that they can be prepared to offer assistance if called upon.

Q. How will the reservoir projects be funded?

A. The cost of the projects will ultimately be funded via water company customer bills, given that our customers will benefit from these supplies. In order to ensure the best possible value through a competitive process, our regulator Ofwat has proposed delivery mechanisms which involve third party providers delivering, owning and maintaining these assets.

Q. How will seldom heard groups be consulted?

A. As part of our ongoing conversations with local authorities, we've been exploring how we can best ensure that our consultation in the autumn provides an opportunity for everyone to share their thoughts on our proposals. We've identified a shortlist of approximately 50 seldom heard groups per reservoir and are contacting these groups to ask for their guidance on how best to engage with the people they represent.

Q. How will leakage be prevented? Is Anglian Water still focused on current water delivery?

A. Anglian Water continue to lead the water sector in tackling leakage, exceeding our regulatory targets in excess of 10 years running with water lost per kilometre at half the national average.

Q. Will both reservoirs serve Anglian Water customers and what increase in water supply will they provide?

A. Both reservoir projects combined will provide an additional 210 million litres of water per day to Anglian Water customers, with 160 million litres from the Lincolnshire reservoir and 50 million litres from the reservoir in the Fens. The proposed new reservoir in the Fens is being developed in partnership with Cambridge Water and would supply water to both Anglian Water and Cambridge Water customers.

Q. Will the new reservoirs create new jobs for local people?

A. Our ambition is that both the construction phase and longer-term operation of the reservoirs will create significant opportunities for job creation in the region.

Q. As the reservoirs will not be fully operational until the mid-2030s, what is your interim solution to ensure sufficient water supply?

A. We're working with our customers to reduce water consumption and are leading the industry on reducing leakage. We have committed £7.5million to 49 flood protection schemes. Work is already underway in a half-billion-pound investment to lay hundreds of kilometres of new, interconnecting pipes to bring water from the wettest areas in the north of Lincolnshire to the drier areas in the south and east. We are also installing over one million smart meters in customer homes and delivering a multitude of abstraction reduction programmes.

15.2 Cllr Helene Leeming- Speed Watch Email

Dear Joe and John,

I am making initial steps towards establishing a Speedwatch Group in Cambourne. I have been in touch with Amanda Large, a Cambridgeshire police officer involved with Speedwatch as part of the partnership and prevention team.

I know that this is an issue that so many of our residents feel strongly about. I have been given the details of one volunteer from the last time we had a Speedwatch group, but I wondered whether any of the town councillors would be interested in working with me to help establish a group of volunteers. Beth Watson of the Community Safety Partnership will help with training and potentially some funding. I will be trying to drum up support on Facebook Groups in the coming weeks, but I would like to work with town councillors as well if possible.

PRINCIPLES OF GRANT AID

Cambourne Town Council aims to operate a grant aid system which considers grant applications. Applications are considered by the Finance and Policy Committee or by the full Council as appropriate.

The Town Council Grant Aid System aims to:

- Help Cambourne voluntary groups to improve their effectiveness
- Help to ensure the provision of services needed by Cambourne residents via the voluntary sector
- Support organisations which meet the needs of people experiencing social and economic difficulties and
- Promote equality of access and opportunity for all Cambourne residents to the services and funds it provides

The Town Council values the diversity and strengths of the local voluntary sector and acknowledges its independent role in the community as:

- A source of valuable services
- A means of enabling people to work together
- A channel for campaigning and advocacy

The Town Council defines a voluntary group as a 'not-for-profit' organisation, set up and run by a voluntary, unpaid management committee.

This document gives the Town Council's general funding principles and details its expectations of all groups in receipt of grant aid.

N.B. Grants are not made to individuals.

Groups applying for grant aid should note:

- Grants are made only to groups meeting the needs of Cambourne residents.
- Grants are made to encourage new groups or new projects, to meet deficits on future running costs, or to help with the costs of some one-off expenditures
- Grants will only be made to groups which **need** financial help. Accumulated reserves will be considered when grant levels are decided.
- Grants are normally made for one year's expenditure at a time and should be spent within the year for the purpose for which they were given. They should not be added, wholly or partly, to reserves unless part of a previously approved programme of funding for a particular project.
- Grants cannot be made to cover money already spent. Groups with premises should apply for discretionary rate relief from South Cambridgeshire District Council.
- Grants will not be made to groups which operate for private gain or are connected with any political party.
- Grants will not be made to groups or organisations who promote hatred or intolerance of any kind.

- Grants may be made to religious organisations for social or welfare purposes, but not to cover the costs of worship or conversion.
 - Groups will be required to return grant aid if they close, if a project or services funded by the Council is not satisfactorily provided, or if the money is not spent as described in the Application for Financial Assistance.

Voluntary groups grant-aided by the Council are required to:

- Ensure efficient levels of administration, hold regular meetings, keep minutes and circulate information to group members.
- Keep proper accounts. Grants may only be made to groups which have submitted satisfactory accounts, unless the group is recently formed.
- Report back to the Council as required to the Council on their activities
- Involve group members and users in policy-making and in the management of activities and services
- Be open to eligible users, as defined by the group's constitution
- Establish and monitor equal opportunities policies and practices
- Meet the legal responsibilities of an employer where appropriate; adopt, implement and monitor good employment practices and procedures
- Recruit and support volunteers where appropriate
- Acknowledge the Town Council's support in annual reports.

Community MiniBus annual insurance for 2022/23-1022.32

This minibus will be used by various community groups with a no-profit-no-loss policy. Since the community bus arrived, we have received many requests from different community groups in Cambourne.
CamCare UK needs to charge a nominal fee that covers annual insurance cost and the maintenance for the minibus. After discussion with the residents and the parents of CERC the price was decided to keep a 90 pounds deposit and 90 pence per miles which is much cheaper in comparison to the private hire.
Having this grant money approved, the charity can give the minibus a much lower price to the community only with the petrol cost and a maintenance value included.
The seniors of the community,CVC and other groups have also requested to exempt this insurance cost. The charity CamCare UK is willing to help the communities in Cambourne, having some funding from the Council will make the cost cheaper, and more groups can use the bus.
CamCare UK will be able to offer the bus at a cheaper cost, only if they have some funding to pay the insurance cost, otherwise the charity does not have any other earning.
