The Town Council does not control the road and bus stops this is the Highway Authority (Cambridgeshire County Council) that carries out this role. I have been to a number of meetings were this subject has been raised. Their response was that they prefer the busses to be in the road as when they are in laybys the busses get stuck there and cannot get out. They have in other areas removed laybys or relocated the bus stops so the busses stop in the road.
